

More linear in their telling and pedestrian in the lessons learned these plays show the difficulties of being in love when a society is bent on conformity and paternal rule. The end result found in Japanese Plays is a wonderful selection of classic Japanese dramatic literature sure to enlighten and delight.

I bought this book in order to receive an introduction to Japanese theater, and was also considering

"No Plays" (Japanese No Dramas (Penguin Classics) and a couple of others. This volume highlights plays from kyogen theater and Kabuki, in addition to Noh, which provides a broader view of the Japanese theater tradition. However, I would have appreciated a little more context for the plays and their authors, as this book only has an overall introduction, and then leaves the genres and plays without any context. Since this book is only meant as introduction, I think it has nice translations and offered a good overview of what is out there.
